This course seeks to explore the evolution and development of social behavior and cognition (social relationships, social learning, social conformity, prosocial and cooperative behavior) in humans and their closest relatives, apes, providing students with a thorough foundation in academic knowledge and research skills for developing comparative approaches to social behavior studies. All students will have the opportunity to participate in practical methodological exercises, such as analyzing behavioral data collected in different contexts provided by the lecturer.
